Onomastic units of a literary text are a paradox in terms of perception: being versatile for understanding in a variety of languages in their denotative sense, in terms of connotations (assessment, expression, association), they are the most closely related to the specific linguistic and cultural environment, the most ethno-specific vocabulary reservoir.
